Additional Information:

Medical Authorization Form: If your child needs to take medication during school, a new medication authorization form needs to be completed each school year. No medications will be given to students without proper authorization from a primary care provider. This includes over-the-counter medications (Tums, Motrin, Tylenol, Ibuprofen, cough drops, etc.)

Asthma: Any child that has ASTHMA listed under Allergies & Conditions in their Medical file, needs to have an inhaler in the office with a Medication Authorization Form on file, and an Asthma Action Plan filled out by your physician and turned into the office.

Allergies: Any child with ALLERGIES to things such as peanuts, eggs, milk, etc. that have been diagnosed and confirmed by a doctor that require an Epi-Pen/Auvi-Q, must have one at school in case of an emergency, as well as an Allergy Action Plan filled out by your physician and turned into the office.

Epilepsy/Seizure Disorders: Any child with EPILEPSY/SEIZURE DISORDERS needs to have a Seizure Action Plan filled out by your physician and turned into the office.

Food Substitution Form: If your child requires a food substitution **due to** a **medical condition or food allergy,** a new food substitution form needs to be completed each school year and signed by the child's primary care provider.
